Exhibit and graphic designer Paul Trapido specializes in transforming content-driven stories into compelling visitor experiences. His projects include the National WWII Museum in New Orleans; the Griffin Discovery Room at Monticello; the Petrosains Discovery Centre in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia; the National Aquarium in Baltimore; and a number of projects with Talbott Exhibits & Planning. Since establishing Paul Trapido Interpretive Design in 2010, he has designed exhibits for aquariums in Virginia and Canada; Philadelphia's Academy of Natural Sciences of Drexel University and Rosenbach Museum & Library; the Free Library of Philadelphia; the African American Museum in Philadelphia, and the National Park Service (Allegheny Portage National Historic Site). Paul's current projects include the redesign of the Railroad Museum of Pennsylvania, a new Children's History Center at the Burlington Historical Society, and new interactive exhibits at the American Helicopter Museum and Education Center.
